

■ **handcuffs** *n* [pl] metal rings joined by a chain, for fastening round a prisoner's wrists ► **handful** *n* [C] as much as can be held in one hand 2 [sing] small number 3 [sing] (informal) person or animal that is difficult to control ■ **hand-held** *adj* small enough to be held in the hand while being used ► **hand-held** *n* ■ **hand-picked** *adj* carefully chosen ■ **hands-free** *adj* (esp of a telephone) that can be operated without using your hands ■ **'handshake** *n* shaking of sb's hand with your own, as a greeting, etc ■ **handstand** *n* movement in which you balance yourself on your hands, with your feet in the air ■ **'handwriting** *n* [U] (style of) writing by hand
